CHECKLIST OF WEED MANAGEMENT

- Identification
- Extent
- How did it get there, can it be stopped, where will it go next.
- What is it affecting, does it need controlling?
- Risks and off target species
- Method of control
- Time of year, stage of growth.
- Control
- Monitoring and evaluation of effectiveness.

METHODS OF CONTROL

- Manual
- Fire and flame and steam
- Mechanical
- Chemical

HERBICIDE TYPES

- Contact
- Systemic
- Selective

FEATURES THAT MAKE A SUCCESSFUL WEED

- Rapid germination and growth
- Resistance to predation, adaption to control techniques
- Distribution of propagules
- Tall and spreading
- Quick to reproduce
- Wide niche
- Transformer species
